What's the difference between a sweet potato and a yam?

Most people think that long, red-skinned sweet potatoes are yams, but they really are just one of many varieties of sweet potatoes. A true yam is generally imported to America from the Caribbean. It is rough and scaly and very low in beta carotene.

Depending on the variety, sweet potatoes can vary from white to orange to purple.

The orange-fleshed variety was introduced to the United States several decades ago. In order to distinguish it from the white variety everyone was accustomed to, producers and shippers chose the English form of the African word "nyami" and labeled them "yams."




